New 'Circles of support' project

When people develop dementia they often find their personal networks of support get smaller. Families and friends may be reluctant to help, frightened by the condition or unable to see how they could contribute.

As a result many people with dementia miss out on opportunities for support and advice and can become isolated, depressed and vulnerable to other health issues. People with dementia and their families tend to manage alone.



Circles of support is an established model of enabling older and disabled people to lead the lives they want to lead. This project is about seeing how it will work with people with dementia.

The person with dementia will be in the driving seat of key decisions about their support. Circles of support build upon people's natural networks in their local communities including family members, neighbours, friends and volunteers, as well as paid staff. The aim is to provide shared support to help people carry on living in their local communities.

This project will work with local groups in four different areas to adapt and test the idea of circles of support for people living with dementia. Circles will be developed for 40 people living with dementia over three years. 'Circles' will improve awareness, understanding and confidence in enabling people to live well with dementia.

The project is funded by the Department of Health's Innovation, Excellence and Service Development Fund and will be run by the National Development Team for Inclusion.

The Mylife system presents these technologies through an easy-to-use touch screen interface.

The system will include:

- a personal calendar
- photo albums
- music.



The Mylife service has been developed in Norway by a small technology company called Karde AS.

We are part of a European project along with Housing21 and Trent Dementia Services Development Centre. There are also other partners in Norway and Germany.

We will be working with people with dementia and their carers to test the system to make sure that it works well for people with dementia in the UK.
